Mainstreaming Lakes in the Global Water Agenda

Background and Purpose

ILEC, with the support of UNEP, has prepared a draft Statement entitled, *"The Need to Mainstream Lakes and Other Lentic Waters Within the Global Water Agenda"*^[1]. As a follow up, this forthcoming International Webinar addresses this subject, with participation by selected countries in Asia and Africa, each providing an overview of their lake basin management national policies and programs as well as the experience and lessons learned so far in their implementation. The presentations will also include their adoption of the Integrated Lake Basin Management (ILBM) framework within their national water resources and river basin management plans as represented by such frameworks as Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) and Integrated River Basin Management (IRBM). The outcomes of this Webinar are hoped to serve as a basis for future discussions on this subject at the global level at such fora as the 5th Session of United Nations Environment Assembly, UNEA5 (Feb. 2021), 9th World Water Forum, WWF9 (March 2021), and 18th World Lake Conference, WLC18 (Nov. 2021).
