- Raise global awareness of World Lake Day and propose new initiatives.












## Program Details (tentative)

9:00–9:05	Opening	Start the session with a brief introduction to Sustainable Lake Management (SLM) and an overview of global youth engagement activities to date.
9:05–9:15	Message from the Next Generation (Kids in Action)	Elementary and junior high school students share their heartfelt ideas on what they can do to protect and care for lakes. A powerful glimpse into the minds of our future stewards.
9:15–10:25	Film Session	Watch a series of short films created by youth from around the world, showcasing their local lake conservation efforts. Each team will give a brief live explanation of their project, followed by a Q&A.
10:25–11:20	Discussion	Join youth leaders in a thoughtful discussion on how to promote sustainable lake conservation through citizen science, environmental education, and active community engagement, etc. We'll also reflect on the personal and cultural importance of lakes, and how these connections can drive meaningful youth-led actions toward World Lake Day.
11:20–11:25	Launch of Online Platform	Be the first to see the launch of a new online space for youth to collaborate, share information, and connect their lake conservation efforts worldwide.
11:25–11:30	Closing	Summarize discussion points and outline next steps for the global youth lake movement.
